On behalf of the University of Florida's College of Medicine Office of Student Affairs, I would like to congratulate you on your offer of admission to the College of Medicine.

In fulfilling its commitment to provide all students with opportunities to take full advantage of the medical education program, the College recognizes that students with documented disabilities may require reasonable accommodations to meet the College's [Technical Standards](#).

Students with disabilities who experience access barriers and would like to request accommodations should connect with the University of Florida's [Disability Resource Center \(DRC\)](#). Accommodations are available for students with disabilities, such as: Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD); Mental Health Conditions, such as Anxiety and Depression; Medical/Health Conditions, such as Crohn's Disease, Low Vision, and Migraines; and Learning Disorders, such as a Reading Disorder.

Given the pace of the medical school curriculum, I encourage students with disabilities to register with the DRC either in advance of or at the beginning of their first semester to ensure access to accommodations to the fullest extent possible. Even if you do not plan to access your accommodations immediately, early registration is still encouraged so that if accommodations are needed, your DRC registration is already in place.

Please be assured that information provided to the Disability Resource Center is voluntary and confidential and your registration with the DRC will not be reflected on your academic transcript.
